Opening Hours

We will be returning to normal opening hours as of Monday 2nd November 2020. The nursery will open at 7.30am and close at 6.30pm

Christmas & New Year Closure:

The nursery will close for the Christmas and New Year period on Wednesday 23rd December at 4:30pm and reopen on Tuesday 5th January 2021.

Annual Summer Closure

We have decided to implement an annual closure during the summer term each year, as this will enable us to close for a shorter period of time over Christmas and New Year. This will be effective as of January 2021. Therefore, the nursery will be closed for one week from *Monday 2nd August 2021 to Friday 6th August 2021*. Please note that full fees remain payable over all setting closures.

Home Activity Idea Make an African Mask

Have fun with your child by making an African mask together. This is a great opportunity for you to celebrate Black History Month and an opportunity to explore black history in more depth.

You will need:

- Paper plate
- Paints
- Ice lolly stick
- String, wool or feathers
- PVA glue
- Sticky tape
- Scissors

Method:

Pre-draw very simple African inspired patterns on each paper plate, cut out eye-holes. Show your child how to decorate their mask by dipping a cotton bud into the paints and making dot designs. Next add some hair made from feathers or coloured paper, string, or wool. Finish off by using sticky tape to fix a lolly stick to the back of each mask for holding on to.

Home Learning Packs

Throughout the first March lockdown and during the recent temporary closure of Greenleaf site, we provided parents and carers with Home Learning Packs to support their children's learning and development at home. Greenleaf Site Reopened

Due to a member of staff testing positive for COVID, it was necessary to close Greenleaf site temporarily. During this closure we worked closely with Public Health England to ensure that we followed all procedures correctly. Following a deep clean of the setting and no other confirmed cases, we reopened on Friday 30th October 2020. We would like to thank all parents and carers for their continued support during these difficult times.

November to December 2020 Lockdown

As you are aware, on Saturday 31st October, the Government announced another national lockdown commencing from Thursday 5th November until Wednesday 2nd December 2020. The Government's intention is that all early years provisions, schools, colleges and universities will remain open, we will therefore continue to operate as we currently have been, still following the same procedures as outlined in the column opposite. We will update you with any changes that we will make to our service as per Government or Local Authority guidance. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact us.

COVID 19 Procedures

As of July 2020, early years settings are no longer required to keep children in "bubbles" as per Government guidance. We are therefore working with children in smaller groups as recommended. We are continuing with our thorough infection control measures which include; checking your child's temperature upon arrival and on departure, using the hand sanitiser, regular handwashing, shoe disinfecting and cleaning the setting regularly throughout the day.

We will continue to provide you with verbal feedback over the phone regarding your child's day in the nursery.

In order to ensure that we minimise the risk of COVID 19 infection within the setting, and to ensure that children who have been unwell are able to return to the nursery, you will be required to complete a Health Declaration Form. This form will ask you share what symptoms your child had when they were unwell, the action you took and the result of the COVID 19 test if one is performed. You will asked to confirm that your child is COVID symptom free and well enough to return to the nursery.

Please beware that if your child displays any of the COVID 19 signs and symptoms whilst at the nursery, you must take them home. Your child cannot return until a COVID 19 test has been performed and the result received. You must adhere to Government guidelines with regards to isolation if required.

The setting returned to normal hours as of Monday 2nd November. We respectfully ask all parents/carers to adhere to their allocated drop off and collection times, in order to minimise children and parents/carers arriving/leaving at the same time..

We would like to take this opportunity to thank all parents and carers for their continued support
